


# Federation negotiates a three per cent pay rise for officers

 Rank and file police officers will see a three per cent rise in their pay packets following official approval from the Home Secretary.


The pay increase was agreed at a meeting of the Police Negotiating Board, who hammered out a pay deal between the staff side and official side, last month.

John Francis, general secretary of the Federation, involved in negotiations, said: 'We are pleased that officers will see an increase in their pay packets that will maintain their position with inflation. The Federation negotiates this rise every year on behalf of police officers and it is the cornerstone of our pay package.'

The increase in pay will come into effect from September 1 this year and would mean a constable with two years service will earn an extra £702.

The three per cent increase will also apply to competency related threshold payments, dog handler's allowance, London lead for inspecting ranks and the

Police Federation Northern Ireland supplements and allowances.
