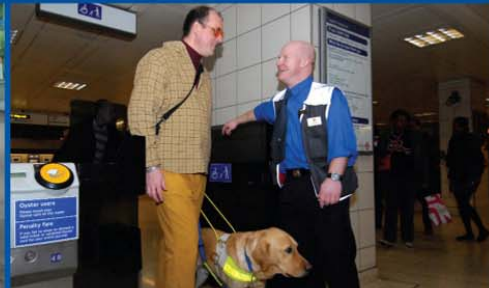

Major Events

- Its a multi agency environment!
- TfL are part of the London Operational and Safety Planning Group for each event
- TfL Representatives at the Event Liaison Team and the MPS Special Operations Room
- TfL Gold Group provides coordination between modes and other transport partners

TfLs Response to an External Event

- We will quickly know if events are malicious or not
- Initial questions and focus:
 - What's happening? – company picture
 - What's happening? – global picture
 - What's it doing to us? – impact & consequences
- Must keep London moving - **safely**

TfLs Response to an External Event



- Operation Bus Stop will be instigated – Buses will turn at pre determined locations for their routes to minimise disruption to service and to ensure that the vehicles are outside of any emergency services cordons.

TfLs Response to an External Event



- London Underground will close stations that are impacted or can adversely impact the network and may run through trains rather than close lines completely.
- London Underground will be supported by London Buses

TfLs Response an External Event



Not all roads involved may be owned and managed TfL!

- The London Streets Traffic Control Centre will begin traffic easing to minimise congestion and to clear roads for the emergency services in the area around the incidents.

2012 Games Planning

3 'operating conditions' that we are addressing

- Business as usual including the 'games increment' during Games time plus peak activity in Games Time
- Contingency response/mitigation - loss of part of LU line / part of DLR, road closure – burst water main
- Contingency response to a major incident in London i.e. major flooding, industrial accident, terrorism etc
