John Montague joined the CPS in 2004 after 11 years in private practice. He became a Crown Advocate in 2006 and regularly appeared at the Crown Court while working for CPS Dorset. In 2011 John became Chief Crown Prosecutor for Wiltshire but after a year the position was absorbed in a restructure.

As Senior District Crown Prosecutor for Hampshire John has the overall responsibility for all Crown Court units and the Rape and Serious Sexual Offences (RASSO) units in Wessex. John is the National Lead for CPS for offences against
