### VIEW FROM THE CHAIR – FOREWORD BY ALEX CHARGE



#### Welcome to the latest edition of the Hampshire Police Federation Newsletter.

This month, we have been working with the force around Brexit planning; the focus being around making sure that officers' welfare and wellbeing is taken into consideration in the planning, and that you are kept up-to-date in what is a uncertain and changeable environment. It is vital that any decisions around leave embargoes are well thought through and reviewed when the information changes.

South East Regional Allowance was introduced in 2001 and was valued at £1000; with inflation it is now worth about £600 in real terms. Hampshire Police Federation has put a proposal to the chief to increase the SE Regional Allowance so that its real terms value returns to £1000. We will update you with the response. We are also working with our SE regional colleagues in order to change the allowance so that it recognises the cost of living in the South East rather than just being about recruitment and retention.

This month, we have also been fighting to make conditions better for student constables. After Hampshire Police Federation was approached by students who were struggling financially, a number of options were considered as part of discussions between us and the force. Whilst I cannot go into specific details, the situation for these students has since been satisfactorily resolved following my intervention, resulting in a significant reduction of their financial vulnerability.

We worked with HR to resolve this, and as a result there is now a policy in place to manage such situations going forward.

### VIEW FROM THE CHAIR, CNTD...

I am pleased to say that we have achieved the first step and this will now go to the Police Pay Review Body (PRRB) as part of the written recommendations from the Police Federation to the PRRB.

The exact wording being:

A review is undertaken including both the London and SE Allowances but in the meantime the discretionary element is removed from the SE Allowances; all allowances are set at the upper limit (currently £3000) and that both the London and SE Allowances are uprated in line with inflation.

Finally, as part of the pay review, the PFEW has recommended an across-the-board pay uplift for the next three years. Seeking a five per cent uplift in year one followed by five per cent in each of years two and three. This would enable the National Police Chiefs' Council (NPCC) to demonstrate a commitment to move towards the overall rectification of the gap between current pay and just pay levels. Should a three year pay settlement not be considered possible, then we will seek a one year deal of 6.2%.

As ever we will keep you updated with any progress.


### DID YOU KNOW? FEBRUARY FOCUS ON PERFORMANCE

"Good luck and a big thank you to all of those who work tirelessly in the Hampshire Federation to ensure that the welfare of officer is catered for.


