The online event was told that there are five deaths every day on the UK's roads, with each fatal collision costing the economy £2 million.

#### FORCE'S NEURODIVERSITY CHAMPION SCHEME WELCOMED BY FEDERATION

A brand new Nuerodiversity Champion scheme has been introduced in the Force, to support those living with a neurodiverse condition. 

# 'THE SYSTEM IS SETTING OFFICERS UP TO FAIL'

Fed chair Luke Mitchell has spoken out in response to BBC's Panorama, Will My Crime Be Solved, which highlighted several criminal cases in which the subsequent police investigation appeared inadequate. Luke says: "Unfortunately, the programme demonstrates exactly where policing is at the moment. For things to change, we need better funding and cops need to be paid better.'.





#### MORE OFFICERS INTENDING TO QUIT, Survey reveals

While Oscar Kilo's fourth annual national police wellbeing survey said 'that a large proportion of the policing workforce continued to find their work meaningful', it also found that the intention to quit had increased for police officers to the highest level since the first survey in 2019/20.
