The Prime Minister is delusional for failing to acknowledge the link between the scourge of youth knife crime and cuts to officer numbers, says National Chair John Apter. Our Chair's highly critical response came after a weekend when two 17 year olds were stabbed to death in London and Manchester.

Following the two stabbings the Prime Minister was asked to comment on the situation saying there was "no direct correlation" between police cuts and knife crime and stressed there was a "cross-Government" response to the problem.

National Chair John Apter said: "Our Prime Minister is delusional, steadfastly refusing to acknowledge what is plain for everyone else to see, and in the face of a national crisis that is deeply concerning."

In other news the Federation has told the Government it must face facts - extreme stress in policing is real.

<u>Our Demand, Capacity and Welfare results contradict what the Government says is working</u> when it comes to fighting crime and keeping the public safe. There is an increase in lone working - new research reveals that 76.1% of respondents from relevant frontline roles* indicated that they are often or always single-crewed.

*Classified as Neighbourhood, Response, Roads Policing, Operational Support, Investigations, and other.





When broken down, the NPCC's recommendation to the Police Remuneration Review Body this year works out as less than a 2% pay uplift for each of the next three years. The NPCC are offering 4% in 2019/20, followed by a pay freeze next year, so that they can model the financial impact of their proposed pay structure. "The modelling should already have been done," says your National Secretary Alex Duncan. "It's not fair to penalise officers for lack of progress on pay reform."

No change to status of EU national warranted officers post-Brexit

Due to officers' unique employment status, we have been chasing the Home Office to shed some light on the situation. Although anything EU exit-related is subject to last minute changes, the current stance is police officers should be treated the same as all other EU nationals who find themselves in this position. If a deal is stuck by March 29, regulations will see a 'national of a member state' status switch to a 'British national or EU national with indefinite leave to remain in the UK' status instead.

Memorial honouring heroic officer PC Keith Palmer unveiled

A memorial commemorating PC Keith Palmer GM, who was tragically killed as he protected Parliament, has been unveiled. The remembrance stone was revealed by Prime Minister Theresa May at a reception at Downing Street attended by PC Palmer's family, friends and colleagues. The stone-which was specially commissioned by the Police Memorial Trust - will sit at the Carriage Gates near where he was attacked.
