



















*I am reporting you for the consideration of the question of prosecuting you for the offence of ... [offence], [NOW Caution]*

**Definition of a Road (S.192 of Road Traffic Act 1988)**

*"...in relation to England and Wales, means any highway and any other road to which the public has access, and includes bridges over which a road passes".*

*This includes private roads, private car parks and driveways used by the public (such as supermarket car parks, campsites etc.) where the laws of the road still apply.*

**Definition of Driving**

*Whilst there's no legal definition, 'driving' is generally held to mean 'being in control of both the direction and the propulsion of the vehicle'.*

**Note:** *the driver is still 'driving' even when stationary, with the handbrake on, in a queue of traffic, such as waiting at red ATS*

**Speeding Offences—Endorsable—£100/3pts**

Speed limits depend upon two factors:

1. the type of vehicle, and 2. the classification of the road.

*The 30mph limit applies to all roads with street lighting unless signage indicates otherwise. All speeding offences attract 3pts and £100 fine or 3-9pts and greater fine/disqual. at Court.*

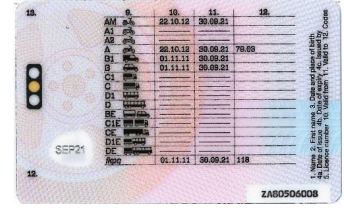
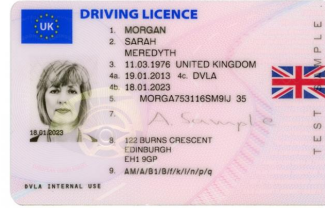

**DRIVING OTHERWISE THAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH DL RT88334 £100 & 3pts ENDORSABLE OFFENCE**

Used when driver holds, or could have been granted, a DL authorising the driving of the vehicle in question AND they were driving in circumstances that ARE NOT in accordance with that licence entitlement.

For example:

- Non-licence holder drive a motor vehicle
- Provisional DL holder driving without supervision / L-plates
- Driving other class of vehicle without supervision / L-plates

**DRIVING OTHERWISE THAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH DL RT88507 £50 & 0pts NON-ENDORSABLE**

Used when a driver would be issued with a licence should they apply to DVLA. For example:

For example (provided driving in accordance with DL):

- Expired Substantive DL and driver has forgotten to renew
- DL revoked due to failure to surrender it for endorsement











**Section 59 Police Reform Act 2002**

Vehicles can be seized if a police officer reasonably believes that a mechanically propelled vehicle is being used in manner: *Causing, or likely to cause alarm, distress or annoyance to the public, and:*

- Contravening Section 3 of Road Traffic Act 1988 (careless / inconsiderate driving), or
- Contravening Section 34 of Road Traffic Act 1988 (prohibition of off-road driving / driving other than on a road)













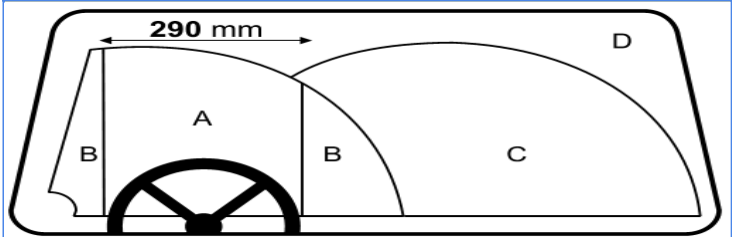

**Tyre Tread Requirements for Passenger Cars, etc.**

Note the Batch No., normally indicated by four digits such as: 4217 indicating Week 42 of 2017.



Sidewalls must be free from cuts or bulges that will affect the strength or integrity of the tyre when under load.

Bulges bulge outwards. A slight inversion, where the rubber is joined, is normal and acceptable.

*Consider heavily marking the outside of an illegal tyre with yellow road chalk or paint in order to make it conspicuous.*
